

The quarantine can be completed wherever the owner prefers.

What is the alternative for a dog, cat, or domestic ferret that has bitten, scratched, or otherwise exposed a human to rabies?

An animal that has been designated by the LRCA as unowned may be euthanized and submitted for testing. A free-roaming, high risk animal that potentially exposes a human MAY be submitted for testing.

Does a low risk animal have to be submitted for testing? Yes. The animal may be allowed to be transferred to a dept licensed quarantine facility, vet clinic, or allowed home confinement IF there is a mutual agreement between LRCA's to do SO.

TAC 169.27(b)

- 1. Secure enclosure to prevent escape.
- 2. Animal was current on rabies vaccine or under 16 weeks of age at the time of the exposure.
- 3. Animal's health must be monitored by custodian and changes reported to LRCA.
- 4. LRCA or vet observation on first and last days of confinement.
- 5. Animal was not a stray as defined by 826.002.

TAC 169.27(a)

False. The quarantine <u>must</u> be done at a department licensed quarantine facility designated by the LRCA. The LRCA **may** allow quarantine at a vet hospital.

Neither quarantine or testing will be required unless the LRCA has reason to believe the animal is rabid.

An animal that has inflicted multiple bite wounds, punctures, or lacerations can be immediately euthanized and tested. If an animal has exposed a human to rabies, but quarantine is not an option what has to happen? Assistance animals are required to quarantine or confine after a potential exposure.

Police service animals are exempt from all rabies quarantine and confinement laws.

It is illegal to vaccinate an animal during the 240 hours following a potential exposure. When an animal completes quarantine, anyone working at the quarantine facility or vet clinic may determine the animal does or does not have clinical signs of rabies.

Rabies vaccines may be sold by feed stores in Texas. An animal's initial rabies vaccine is considered current after _____ days. False. Police service animals are exempt if the bite happens while the animal is undergoing routine vet care or while in the line of duty.




